Second Sunday of Advent (Cycle B) 7th December 2014 'Prepare a way for the Lord.'

The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) rite for entry into the Catechumenate (the second stage in the RCIA process, the first being the Enquiry Stage) will take place at the 9.30am Mass on Sunday at St John's. Our catechumens are Angie Mcgreavy, Dionne Harper, Chelsea Foley, and Stephen Finlayson, and our candidates, Albert Caballero and Sharleena Asiatico. (Catechumens are those who haven't been baptised; candidates are those who were baptised into another tradition, or are Catholics who have yet to receive all the sacraments of initiation – baptism, confirmation and eucharist.) Please pray for them and their sponsors and catechists.

**Next Sunday, 14 December, the Third Sunday of Advent, is our Reconciliation Sunday.** Several priests will be available to celebrate the sacrament during the first half of Mass. On the back of the Sunday Plus in this newsletter is an **Advent 'Examination of Conscience'** – please take time to prepare....

An appreciation of former St John's parishioner, Colin O'Brien (who recently moved to Ireland with his wife Brid, and children Kayleigh & Ryan) - from one of the St John's housebound parishioners, Michael Richards:

"What follows is both a farewell and a word of best wishes to one of those whose labours in the Parish are known about but of course go on quietly and scarcely noticed: Colin O'Brien, one of the St John's team of Eucharistic Ministers who bring Holy Communion to the sick.

To be ministered to by Colin each month during a long period of treatment was a joy. Somehow I had never met Colin before. He turned out to possess deep pastoral gifts of a kind that no parish could ever have too much. They include a listening ear and a listening heart. It came to Maimie and me as no surprise that Colin turned out to have been the attentive neighbour of a friend of ours from our Episcopalian days, an elderly and chronically ill woman to whom he had been for years and years unsparing with practical kindnesses.

Colin's quiet and expert work on Parish finances will have been appreciated even more by those who can grasp such matters than by the rest of us. All can appreciate two of his particular habits in conversation. One is a willingness to accept change in the Church once it has happened. The other is to make sure that anyone whose name cropped up in our talk received some word of praise. I was lucky to meet Brid and Kayleigh and Ryan in the nick of time, on the very eve of their departure for Ireland. I do hope that those who have known Colin ever since he was an altar-boy will not find it a bit impertinent for a late-comer to be writing an appreciation. *Michael Richards* "
