## Possibly Simple - A Reflection on Synodality by Colin Davey

In biological systems, it's the simplest solution that often prevails. Things certainly appear to get more complex over geological time, but (human teenager excepted) nature's hand has learned to get the job done with the least fuss. Embarrassing early mistakes and over-elaborations are confined to the fossil record, skeletons in Earth's cupboard.

I wonder whether this long-honed, baggage-free approach has something to teach us about the synodal process. In her wisdom, nature imparts and distils underlying unities, applying common pathways across very different contexts towards the shared aims of survival and flourishing. In all of nature's immense diversity, from micro-organisms to us humans, from the venomous to the fluffy, you don't need to dig far to find common ground (as witnessed by taxonomy) and, moreover, an intricate web of functional relationships and interdependences to which every member, at every level, makes a crucial contribution. Upset this balance and we're in trouble; look after the lions and ignore the algae at our peril.

Enough allegory. Suffice to say that forging a multilevel network of productive camaraderie, with width as well as height, drawing on underlying shared values, is crucial to tackling the challenges that face our church within contemporary society. I'm reminded that both wisdom and nature are feminine, both nature and synodality guided by the Holy Spirit.

# A REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL FOR THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT – Mark 13: 33-7

(The author of this reflection is a friend of Fr Jock who lives in Northumberland)

I'm writing these few words on Wednesday evening. Tomorrow, I am due to receive a full knee replacement. I have waited 3½ years to reach the top of the waiting list, and of late, walking has been really painful. I am ready. Despite my state of readiness, almost eagerness, I still have some preparations to make. My usual cocktail of medications has been adjusted – some tablets stopped three days ago, some two, and several more again, tomorrow. There is a nasal gel to apply to minimize the risk of infection, ointments to apply to the skin over my knee-cap, there are rules about light breakfast, cut-off times for tea and coffee, sips of water and the rather strange admonition: *Please make sure you shower or bathe before coming into hospital*. I once asked a nurse friend if such a request was necessary. Her reply: *You'd be surprised by the state of some patients who present for surgery!* It reminded me of my late mother who, whenever I was going 'out' on a weekend would instruct – 'Make sure you're wearing clean underwear, in case you are knocked over and taken to hospital!'. I assumed there was an unwritten rule for ambulance drivers – no emergency admissions if the casualty is not wearing pristine underwear!

Preparation is so much a part of life. We prepare for job interviews, new school academic years, going away for the first time to university, we buy or rent our first home where we can be truly independent: soft furnishings are bought, crockery and cutlery, the paraphernalia of modern life. The arrival of a new baby requires particularly careful preparation - a carefully packed suitcase by the front door for the trip to the maternity unit. The baby is coming. He or she hasn't time to wait for you to pack what you need. So, a suitcase is prepared, in readiness.

Last week, I told you of Mr. and Mrs. KitKat and the mystery of the missing two fingers. I stood, 'guilty as charged'. This week, I met Mr. and Mrs. Eco Warrior. We were at the fish seller counter in Hexham Market. Supermarket fish tends to be farmed and is full of all sorts of additives. Most of these additives are deemed to be legal, but I don't believe any legislation that ends up in the statute books in return for massive political donations. We shun supermarket fish. Mr & Mrs Eco Warrior were of the same opinion. They seemed to be willing to go one step further than me. Well into their 70's (I later found out that Mrs. was 84), they shunned plastic as far as they could. They had made their own string shopping bags and, more impressively, had little stainless containers for their purchases. Margarine tubs were washed and re-used. They had their own container for their fish. Tins with green lids for their vegetable purchases, paper bags for fruit. One bag contained the empty containers, one bag for those that were full. I felt positively ignorant accepting my fish in a plastic bag. We chatted for a while. They were fascinating. They had so much of their experiences to share, no-one appeared to be listening. All of their clothes were from charity shops, they shunned cars and either walked or cycled. I asked if they ever felt they were wasting their time in following their chosen lifestyle. 'Oh! I never really think that. Time is just to be lived and enjoyed. We don't know how much time we have. We just live for now. Nothing else seems all that important.' She looked to her husband for approval. 'I never feel we are wasting our time', he added. 'It's all time well spent. Preparing a meal is as enjoyable as eating it. Preparing is our way of showing God that we are grateful and care for what he has given us.' 'Do you believe in God?' I asked. 'Of course,' he replied, 'don't you?'

We are beginning the Season of Advent. It's a Season of preparation for Christmas. Take your time. Savour these days. We prepare for the second coming of Christ by remembering his first. Jesus will come into our lives. We will meet him even as the last breath leaves our mortal bodies. We may be able to postpone it through healthy living – but we cannot put it off forever. We will leave this earth. We will die. We just don't know when.

Our gospel passage is taken from Mark. Jesus tells us of the landowner who decided to 'travel abroad' leaving his staff in charge. All he asks is they look after the place in his absence. He doesn't know how long he will be away. What will the servants do? Work or Party? Indulge their appetites or diligently repay and return his trust? They have no idea when he is coming back – he didn't tell them how long he would be gone. This is Jesus' advice to us: Stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming: evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep, so stay awake.
