<u>2 NEW INITIATIVES</u>:

I) The Community Bible Experience:

Jennifer Morris writes: "One of the opportunities for faith development on offer as we approach Lent and Easter is something called a 'Community Bible Experience', which has proved interesting and fruitful in several different places where it has been tried.

The aim is to read the New Testament over 8 weeks. Copies of the New Testament – specially designed for this approach - will be available, and each week participants will meet in the same small group to discuss what they've been reading. (However if you can't make every week that is ok.)

These gatherings are designed to feel more like **a book club** than a traditional Bible study. They're an opportunity to share how God's story is making an impact on each person—what inspires, surprises, puzzles, or challenges us. There's no advance preparation required for participants other than keeping up with each day's suggested reading (or catching up with the week's reading just before the 'club' meets!).

If you are interested in this opportunity please put your name and contact details on the sheets at the back of the Church..

When we know how many people wish to participate we'll arrange dates and times for meeting. However if you're ready to join an existing group with Christians from other churches, we can arrange for you to join groups at St Mark's Episcopal Church which is also offering the 'Community Bible Experience'. Groups begin meeting there on 7 February (7-8pm) and 8 February (lunchtime). It would be good if we, too, could organise a couple of groups to start then as it would mean completing the programme by Easter....'

II) Interested in joining a Youth Group?:

Once a month a youth group for P7-S6 meets at St Mark's on a Sunday evening from 6 to 7.30pm. During their time together the members play games, eat, and have a discussion on a topic of faith. The dates for the youth group are given out in advance. We hope in the coming weeks to encourage some of our young people to join this ecumenical group – more details will follow soon...
