The Renewal of the St John's Legho Partnership – and the gift of a Processional Cross for the new Parish

Mike Knox writes: 'At the recent open meeting to look at the development of St John's relationship with Legho Village it was decided to have a meeting at 8.00pm (NB Change of Time) on Monday 11 September in the Parish House to plan the next steps of the development of our partnership. All most welcome..
