# Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – 14 April 2019

Keeping a Holy Lent

**WELCOME....**If you're visiting, are new to the area, or just live here, you are most welcome in our sister parishes. We are delighted you have joined us. If you are new to the parish please make yourself known to Fr Jock and ask for details of how to register on the parishes' roll.



This Sunday is Palm Sunday ... and our Lenten journey culminates in all the services during Holy Week. It is the most important week in the year for every Christian. Please follow Jesus on his journey from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday...and please continue to pray for our RCIA catechumens Graham Sinclair, and Peter Henstock (from St Ninian's), and our candidate, Erin Crolla, who will be baptised/received, confirmed and make their first communion at the Easter Vigil this Saturday evening, 20 April. (Peter has been part of the RCIA group but is being baptised at his own parish of St Ninian's).

St John's Church will be open each day of Holy Week from 9.15am-4.30pm giving everyone the opportunity to have some quiet time for prayer and reflection.



**Please remember to return your SCIAF 'wee boxes'** during Holy Week – ideally before Holy Thursday so they can be included in that evening's Offertory Procession.

At the Good Friday Solemn Liturgy (3pm – St Mary Magdalene's), as you enter you will be offered a stone. Later in the service, when process to venerate the Cross we will have the opportunity of leaving 'our' stone in one of the baskets at the foot of the Cross – a symbolic way to leave our cares and worries at the feet of our Saviour, crucified out of love for us.

Those attending the Ecumenical Stations of the Cross (on Monday night at 7pm) and the Easter Vigil are encouraged to bring small torches/mobile phones (on silent...!) in order to be able to participate while the Church is in darkness.



Once again, this Easter we are collecting donations of Easter eggs at both Masses on Easter Sunday. These will be distributed to those in need and to the homeless.

Our next **Baptismal Preparation Course** will be on **Wednesday 24 April and Wednesday 1 May** at 7.30pm in the Parish House.

# Walking the Labyrinth (at St Mark's this Wednesday – 2-8pm)

**Revd Sophia Marriage writes**: 'The labyrinth is an ancient archetypal pattern found in many cultures around the world dating back more than 4000 years.

Labyrinths were a feature of many medieval cathedrals - one of the best remaining examples is found in Chartres Cathedral in northern France. The one we have at St Mark's is a classic seven ring labyrinth. The oldest known example of such a labyrinth in rock art is in Sardinia dated about 2000-2500 years ago, and there is another in India thought to be between 8000-9000 yrs old.

Unlike a maze that challenges the mind with blind alleys, dead ends and choices to be made, labyrinths have only one clear, winding path leading you from the outer edge into the centre and back out again. Walking the path offers a unique space to slow down, still the mind and explore the inner landscape of the soul. It can be walked as an aid to contemplative prayer and reflection, as a spiritual exercise, or as a form of pilgrimage. Sometimes for specific seasons of the year, leaflets may provide a guided path or stations, which you may use if you want. For Holy Week at St Mark's, we have such a meditation on the events of Holy Week should you want it.

The path has three stages - the **inward** journey, the **centre** and the **outward** journey – a letting go of things which hinder our approach to God, a sitting with God in peace and listening for God's word's, and a return to the world – through new insights and in the new relationships we are called into.

| When you enter the labyrinth you can trust yourself to the simple path ahead and begin to slow down. As you walk to the centre let it be a time to release the thoughts and feelings preoccupying you. Allow your mind to quieten. In this part of the journey we can let go of things which hinder our wholeness and inner approach to God.          |

| When you reach the centre be still. It is a place of openness and receiving. Here is a space of meditative prayer and peace. Linger for as long as you would like.  |
| As you leave the centre and go on your outward journey reflect on any insights and connections that may have come to you and begin to integrate new insights and possibilities into your life. Or as you come out consider the theme relationship - with ourselves, with others and with the planet - seen in the light of our relationship with God. |

For some the experience of walking the path may offer a renewed sense of well-being and inner peace. Others may use it to focus on a particular question or issue. For others it will be primarily a path of meditation or prayer. There is no right or wrong way to walk a labyrinth. Use it in whatever way is helpful for you. As with any form of prayer, sometimes it can deeply enrich our relationship with God and at other times we may not find it useful. It is normally particularly useful for those who struggle to sit still to prayer as the meditative action of walking can calm our mind.'
