Coronavirus

A suggestion from a Fife parishioner in her 80's: 'I had an idea come in to my head on Sunday after Mass. Very simple but prayer is always needed....to wash our hands properly it takes the same time as to say an Our Father or two Hail Mary's – why not say them for those who have the virus and to ask God to help spread the disease? What else can you do while washing your hands? I have always remembered being told that we can pray anywhere...'

This Sunday - 15 March - at 7pm in St John's Hall there will be a Presentation (with photos and videos) from our Tanzania and Malawi Pilgrims – all most welcome. The meeting will conclude with the first showing in our parish of the **remarkable short film** made by **Abigail Mazeko** before she returned to the STEKA Home in Malawi, movingly describing her journey from being a victim of human trafficking in South Africa – via STEKA – to Queen Margaret University and the St John's Music Group.

On Monday – at 2.30pm in St John's there will be our monthly Healing Mass (celebrated slightly differently because of the C virus)...and at 7pm, also in St John's, our P3 children will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time – please pray for them, and, if you can, come and support them.

A message from the Justice & Peace Group - 'Donation from St John's Parish Funds to Edinburgh Direct Aid:

'Two years ago, the St John's Parish Pastoral Council agreed that in the event of there being a surplus of income over expenditure at the end of each financial year, 30% of the surplus should be donated to organisations helping people in need – whilst there are always things needing done in the church or the parish house, we mustn't forget those in greater need. The first year after this decision, the parish donated $\pounds 6150.00$ to support the STEKA skill centres being built in Malawi.

This year, following discussion between the J&P Group and the Parish Pastoral Council, we have decided to give to Edinburgh Direct Aid (EDA). This is a small organisation with a long reach. Till recently, it was supporting Syrian refugees living in desperate conditions in Lebanon but the government there has now imposed import punitive taxes including on donated aid. Consequently, EDA has switched its focus to Idlib in Northern Syria where there has been heavy fighting with the result that a million people have been driven from their homes and are now trapped in freezing conditions. At the St John's weekend Masses on 21/22 March representatives from EDA will come along to tell us briefly about the latest developments and to accept a cheque for £4308 from our parish.'

Today, many thousands of women and girls continue to be left inured, traumatised and in urgent need of assistance. Next weekend - Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 March - there will be a second collection in aid of SCIAF and Episcopal Charities.

This year any donations for Fr Jock's annual Sponsored Slim will be going to the Legho Young Christian Communities in Tanzania and **the Steka Skills Workshops** in Malawi.

THE BACKGROUND TO THE TWO PROJECTS

There has been a link between our two parishes and **the village of Legho in the Kilimanjaro Highlands in Tanzania for nearly 40 years** – a direct one for St John's, and via S John' Primary School for St Mary Magdalene's. One of the main aims of the parishes' Pilgrimage in January was to seek to renew these links. It was agreed that one of the best ways of so doing was to support the vibrant 70 strong Young Christian Community there – and so encourage them in all they plan to do with the aim of avoiding the relentless migration from countryside to town and the serious damage done to rural life. More than a decade ago, foundations of a large Centre were laid behind the Priests' house there: the hope now is to begin building again and give the impressive young people two rooms as their own Community Centre...

In the last three years, we have been privileged to have as part of the community of our two parishes at different times, Sandra Ndale, Gift Thompson and Abigail Mazeko, from the **Steka Children's Home in Blantyre in Malawi.** The Home was founded by Godknows and Helen Maseko a decade ago and now contains 74 children living as one remarkable family. Godknows himself had lived on the streets and also been a victim of human trafficking and many of the children in the home have experienced one or the other – or both...while some have just been abandoned. Only one per cent of young people in Malawi are able to go to university so the major challenge for the Home as the children grow older is for them to have the opportunity to learn a trade – hence Godknows' new project to build two 'skills centres' on open land in the countryside half an hour from Blantyre and near where he was brought up. Our parishes raised £23,000 last year towards that but with rampant inflation, the costs have not yet been fully covered.....
